

## **Synopsis**

"Datang Bulan" is one of the euphemisms for most Indonesians to speak about menstruation. It means that the lunar month is coming. Come Moon (2022) is a delicate observational exploration of period poverty. An intimate portrait. A case study for Indonesians.

Atikah, the 14-year-old girl, shares her consciousness and feelings about her menstrual experience. She lives with her Sundanese parents, brothers, and sister in a remote village on Mount Pancar of Sentul, Bogor. A city not so far from Jakarta but is still yet to develop in accessing clean water and proper sanitation facilities.

Atikah's mother and father play influential roles in providing for her needs as a coming-of-age daughter. They describe how they access and manage hygiene during menstruation as Muslims. Living near the river and farms, the parents maintain three bathrooms for their children. In spite of the rainy weather at their home, they carry on as a family.

#### Filmmaker's Statement

"When I was growing up, menstruation felt like a drug transaction to me. I needed to hide the fact that I was in my period. Even though I lived in an urban area, there were still unclear information that I learned from my family and relatives. The rumored myths and taboos made this normal cycle of the female body feel worse for me.

Turns out, I am not the only one.

Most research stated that many girls felt afraid and embarrassed when they first menstruated too. Reasons behind these sentiments are varied but one of them is indelicate knowledge passed from older generations that was based on their socio-cultural beliefs."

### Filmmaker's Biography

Clarissa Ruth Natan is an independent filmmaker from Eastern Indonesia. Based in Jakarta, she holds a bachelor's degree in visual design communication from Universitas Pelita Harapan.

With her technical and artistic dedication in storytelling, Clarissa has been guiding on-screen and off-screen collaborators throughout many stages of the commercial and original projects of Anatman Pictures as an assistant director to award-winning documentarian Mahatma Putra. Prior to working for Anatman Pictures, she was actively directing local commercials as a freelance photographer and cinematographer.



# Exclusive Screening

On the night of Menstrual Hygiene (MH) Day, 28th of May 2022, the director and producer of <u>Datang Bulan</u> (Come Moon) documentary were invited to screen the film in Bali for an event hosted by <u>Perfect Fit</u>, a company of Indonesian-made period underwear & pads.

The screening was held at Garden Canggu restaurant as part of the donation-based event called "Menstru[art]ion]" to celebrate MH Day. It was supported by numerous organizations including Simavi, Kultara, We Are Sisters, and Anatman Pictures. All profits were used to aid female prisoners in Bali with reusable menstrual products & reproductive health education.

The exclusive screening was followed by a warm and insightful discussion with Director Clarissa Natan as a guest speaker. The talk show also featured Veronika Krasnasari (TV host and environment advocate), Sekarputi Sidhiawati (Artist and Co-Owner of Arta Derau), and Riesa Putri (Co-Founder and COO of Perfect Fit).

## Celebration in the Community

To celebrate 25 years of providing decent housing across the nation, <u>Habitat for Humanity Indonesia</u> is back with its annual <u>Volunteer Build</u> program held in Mauk, Tangerang city. The producers of <u>Datang Bulan</u> (Come Moon) documentary were invited to promote the film that the non-profit organization supported.

The long-awaited event was held simultaneously in three cities in Indonesia, namely Tangerang, Surabaya, and Yogyakarta on the 11th of June 2022. The theme was *Rise! Together Building Indonesia*. Previously, the program had been on hold for two years due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

In Kedung Dalem Village of Mauk district, the activities included foundation construction, painting, and walling for beautifying low-income families' homes. Speeches were given by the Habitat National Director Susanto Samsudin, boards, influencers, public figures, and volunteers.
